Our love of God necessitates our love of neighbors. When Jesus washed the disciples' feet, He said, "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet" (Jn. 13:14).

LOVE: The Law and the Prophets are summed up in Jesus' command to love like He loved. Jesus' love is freely offered, sacrificial, rooted in truth, and enduring. We strive to imitate Jesus' way of loving, always wanting the ultimate good for the other and continuing to love even when we are not loved in return.

A JOY THAT INSPIRES OTHERS: We endeavor to demonstrate, through our words and deeds, that we believe that the Gospel is truly Good News, that what God has done for us in Christ Jesus warrants a joyful response from us. We pray that we will come to exude a joyful spirit that is attractive to others and that draws others to better know the source of our joy.

A PATIENCE THAT FOSTERS RELATIONSHIPS: We desire to be patiently present to others, meeting them where they are in life's journey, striving to better know them, and to befriend them. All evangelization begins with relationship, so we want to be good at establishing relationships.

A CHARITY THAT TRANSFORMS HEARTS: Jesus' command to love as He loves provides direction for all our parish efforts. Charity, another word for Love, is the fuel that animates relationships, the knock on the door of people's hearts that invite them to open up, and the foundation upon which trust grows. Our ability to share the Gospel is enhanced when others know we truly care about them.

E – 119<sup>th</sup> St & Blue Valley Pkwy, south on Blue Valley Pkwy to US 69 Hwy, south on US 69 Hwy to 167<sup>th</sup> St. S – US 69 Hwy and 167<sup>th</sup> St, west on 167<sup>th</sup> St to Quivira

W - 167<sup>th</sup> St and Quivira, north on Quivira to 135<sup>th</sup> St, west on 135<sup>th</sup> St to Pflumm, north on Pflumm Rd to 119<sup>th</sup> St

#### PARISH HISTORY OVERVIEW

1988 – Archbishop Ignatius Strecker purchases 35 acres of land.

1991 – Fr. Larry Albertson named Pastor for new parish.

1991 - Officially named Church of the Ascension.

1997 - Church of the Ascension holds dedication ceremony.

1997 – Ascension Catholic School opens K-5 program and then adds one grade per year until it reaches 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

2002 - Fr. Thomas Tank named new Pastor.

2021 - Fr. Gary Pennings named new Pastor.

2023 – 3,289 families in our parish and 577 children in Ascension Catholic School.



#### WHAT IS THE EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL?

The Eucharistic Revival is a three-year initiative that aims to inspire, educate, and unite. In a world where not many people know Christ intimately, the revival is meant to show everyone what wonders the True Presence of Christ can do to heal the soul. Through a carefully planned timeline of events, after three years, the U.S. bishops hope to change the lives of many Catholics and non-Catholics alike.



#### WHY NOW?

Because the Church needs healing and the world needs the Church. Scandal, division, disease, doubt, the Church has withstood each of these challenges throughout our very human history. But today we are facing all of them at once. Our response in this moment is pivotal.

In the midst of these roaring waves, Christ is present, reminding us that he is more powerful than the storm. He desires to heal, renew, and unify the Church He established and the world that was created through Him.

How will he do it? By uniting us once again around the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The National Eucharistic Revival is the joyful, expectant, grassroots response of the entire Catholic Church in the U.S. to this divine invitation.

We all need healing, yet many of us are separated from the very source of our strength. Our Lord Jesus Christ invites us to return to the source and summit of our faith in the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The National Eucharistic Revival is a movement to restore understanding and devotion to this great mystery here in the U.S. by helping us renew our worship of Jesus Christ in the Fucharist



### PENANCE/RECONCILIATION

We are strongly encouraged to receive this sacrament as a regular part of our Christian lives, required at least once a year when in a state of serious sin. Those who have committed serious sin should not receive the Eucharist until they have received the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Reconciliation is one of the first steps in the preparation for receiving First Holy Communion.

### **EUCHARIST/COMMUNION**

At Church of the Ascension, Catholics have the opportunity to receive the Eucharist daily. All Catholics are required to attend Mass on Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation.

Second Grade students enrolled in Youth Faith Formation (YFF) & Ascension Catholic School (ACS) prepare for the celebration of First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Attendance in religion class in the First Grade is a prerequisite for receiving First Reconciliation and First Communion in Second Grade. Parents and students are expected to take a very active part in the preparation for both sacraments.

Third through Eighth Grade students who have not received their First Reconciliation or First Holy Communion will prepare separately in addition to their attendance at YFF/ACS classes in their respective grade levels.

#### CONFIRMATION

The Sacrament of Confirmation is conferred in the Eighth Grade. YFF and ACS students prepare for this Sacrament by attending all scheduled sessions during Seventh and Eight Grade. In addition, they attend the candidate/sponsor sessions designed to assist the spiritual growth of each candidate. Service projects and a retreat are part of the requirements for being ready to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation.

#### ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of strengthening, peace, and courage to overcome the difficulties that coincide with the condition of serious illness or the frailty of old age. Contact the Pastor or Parochial Vicar at 913-681-3348 for available times.

# Youth Ministry

Ascension Youth Ministry exists to draw our teens into deeper relationship with Jesus Christ, to give teens a place to belong, and to equip them to live-out the Great Commission (Mt 28) by the power and guidance of the Holy Spirit.

#### **FIRE**

Middle School (Grades 6-7)

At FIRE, we draw our youth into deeper relationship with the Lord through games, skits, small groups and the occasional off-site laser-tag or go-karting adventure. We meet on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of each month, during the school year, from 5:30pm-7:00pm in the Youth Room.

#### **RISE**

High School (Grades 9-12)

The mission of RISE is to invite our teens to come further up and further into their relationship with Jesus. Our approach is to build relationships with teens so that they can know before all else that they are loved and that Ascension is a place where they will always belong. We do this through fun games and kickoff events, dynamic talks, small group conversations, prayer experiences, and through interaction with trusted adult volunteers

Each night follows the LifeTeen model of Gather, Proclaim, Break, Send. All high schoolers are welcome to join regardless of where they find themselves in their walk with Christ and His Church. For those looking to go deeper in their faith we offer the opportunity to join a small group that meets off-campus an additional night of the week outside of RISE, as well as the opportunity to develop leadership skills through volunteering with our middle school ministry, FIRE.

RISE meets every Sunday (excluding major holidays) from 6-8 pm in the Youth Room. Every night includes dinner and ends with ice cream or s'mores.

## High School Small Group Leaders + Core Team

Last year (2021-2022) we served more than 70 high school students through our programs and this year we desire to reach even more young people. If you have a deep love of our Lord and a desire to share the Good News with others then this could be the place for you! Each volunteer with our high school ministry receives training to make sure they feel fully equipped to meet the needs of our teens as well as opportunities for spiritual growth. 

Ascension Catholic School is a Preschool through 8th grade parish

school. Throughout the building, visitors will see the message that "Christ is the reason for this school. He is the unseen but ever-present teacher in its classes. He is the model of its faculty and the inspiration of its students."

We have a strong academic program which is accredited by the State of Kansas and COGNIA, formerly the North Central Association. We follow the curriculum guidelines established by the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas, a program designed to meet state and national standards for each subject area.

Our dedicated teachers guide students in religion, reading, language arts, mathematics, social studies, science, Spanish, physical education, music, art, library skills, choir, band, and computer technology. Our staff provides instruction which respects students' individual differences, nurtures the whole child, and prepares young people to meet the challenges of the 21st century. The services of a school counselor, nurse, and resource teachers are available on a regular basis. In addition, the school offers daily hot lunch and an after-school care program.

#### Mission

The mission of Ascension Catholic School is to educate, celebrate, and serve in the spirit of Christ. Through the combined efforts of parents, teachers, and parishioners, each student will experience the support of a loving Christian community. They will also attain the necessary academic strengths, social skills, and spiritual development required to meet life's challenges. Dads/ Grandfathers of Ascension students may volunteer for full/ part day shifts to assist in building/ lunch/ recess duty for the day. Volunteers may also join their students for lunch and recess.

Interested parents/ parishioners may volunteer to work in the Ascension workroom with copy/ project requests from teachers.



#### Use of Facilities

Church of the Ascension is a very active parish supporting multiple ministries. This means our facilities are constantly in use. Following are guidelines and process for reserving and using our various facilities.

- Priority of scheduling facility use is as follows:
  - Sacraments > Education > Parish Wide Events (open to all) > Classes, Meetings, Ministry Activities > Archdiocesan Events (with the understanding that at times an Archdiocesan event might rise to a higher priority.)
- A "Space/Resource Request" form must be completed for ALL facility requests. This form can be found on the parish website or the Parish Office. Once completed, the appropriate Ministry Head (staff member) will review the request and approve/disapprove. Due to the amount of activity in our parish, it can never be assumed a certain space is available at any given time. There are *no* exceptions.
- Please be sure to reserve all of the space needed for a function to include time for set-up, clean-up and equipment.
- If the Space Request includes a request to reserve the Nursery or School Gym, the appropriate Ministry Head will need to secure approval from the respective contacts of these locations prior to approval.
- If there is a change in the reservation for any reason, it is the requestor's responsibility to inform the receptionist in the Parish Office. Please do not assume that a conversation with the pastor or another staff member constitutes an official schedule change.
- From September-April, the Parish Hall, Sanctuary, and school facilities are unavailable on Wednesday evenings due to YFF classes.
- Parish-wide fundraisers sponsored by the "parish as a whole" take precedence and may require rescheduling of some events.
- In case of facility conflicts, please check and respect the groups listed on the weekly calendar in the Gathering Space,
   Parish Hall meeting rooms and those listed on the calendar on the parish website.
- If not wanting a meeting or activity to appear in the "Weekly Calendar of Events" published in the weekly bulletin, the
  requester will need to include two asterisks (\*\*) at the end of the Event Name when completing the Space Request
  Form. This will indicate to the bulletin coordinator NOT TO PUBLISH.
- Space is reserved on a one year basis. (ie: Annual Spring CRHP weekends are scheduled a year in advance once the current retreat is over.)
- Facility Requests & Events related to Sacraments, education and Parish Wide Events can be requested by Staff in the spring. Other requests for Classes, Meetings and Ministries can be sent July 1 of each year unless pastoral permission is granted to submit prior to July 1.
- Many facility spaces available to evening parish functions also have a daily designated use. Please respect the layout
  and personal property of the space and leave it clean after use. Please return any items to their original location.
  Diagrams are available showing how these rooms should be arranged at the end of any activity. Please notify the
  Parish Office immediately if anything is broken or damaged in any way.
- Parish Facilities are available only for parish functions and those connected with parish ministries. Due to the large number of parish groups and activities utilizing our limited parish facilities, we are unable to make our facilities available to parishioners for personal or family functions, such as anniversaries, parties, receptions, reunions, etc.
- Gym/Field Rental & Requirements: \$100/hr or \$50/hr if two are renting at the same time. Proof of \$1M insurance
  policy with Church of the Ascension listed as a certificate holder. School/Church events and ministries take priority
  over any Gym/Field rental.
- Surveillance cameras are in use on our property.

# Facility Security-Keys

It is essential our facility remain secure. Keys to all areas are available for check out through the Parish Office. To check out a key(s), one must come to the Parish Office during normal business hours before your event to check out a key. It is each requestor's responsibility to ensure that the facility is locked if they are the last to leave the area! Please do NOT prop open doors! All keys must be returned the next business day following the event either to the Parish Office or placed in the parish mail slot behind the gathering area bulletin board. Keys are NOT to be placed in the any wooden box that might be in the gathering area.

# Fundraising & Special Collections

As a Stewardship Parish, Church of the Ascension relies on the regular tithe contributions of parishioners to support the parish and its ministries. Therefore, every effort is made to MINIMIZE the number of special requests for financial contributions to meet special needs.

Organizations and ministries may sponsor fundraising activities among their own members; however, when these are directed beyond the members of the particular group the following guidelines must be followed. This includes fundraisers conducted by mail, after Masses, and special solicitations for donations.

#### **Fundraising**

- Fundraising of any type must be sponsored/ coordinated through an existing parish ministry. All funds raised must be used for the approved purpose. No fundraising is allowed that benefits a private individual/business, even if proceeds are shared with the parish. No use of Ascension's names and/or logos permitted without prior written authorization from the Minister for Stewardship & Engagement. No purchases may be made from the donations without prior written approval from the appropriate employee ministry head.
- Parish-wide fundraisers sponsored by the "parish as a whole" take precedence and may require rescheduling of some events.

- By July 1 of each year, all groups wishing to sponsor a parish-wide fundraiser during the following 12 months are required to submit a written request stating purpose, method, and dates. This includes annual fundraisers such as Celebrate Ascension, Lenten Fish Dinners, etc. Approval and coordination of all parish-wide fundraisers are the responsibility of the Minister for Stewardship & Engagement. All approved activities are to be entered on the parish calendar. NO INDIVIDUAL OR GROUP IS TO PRESUME PERMISSION TO SPONSOR A PARISH-WIDE FUNDRAISER WITHOUT APPROPRIATE PERMISSION.
- No fundraisers are to take place in the gathering space. As a rule, they are to be conducted in the parish hall.

#### Special Collections

 Many groups wish to sponsor collections of items for the needy, such as toys and clothing. In order to avoid duplication of efforts and to maximize effectiveness, all such collections must be approved and coordinated with the Ministry of Care Director. The Minister for Care & Social Justice will work with the Minister for Stewardship & Engagement in the proper scheduling of such efforts. If these collections focus on cash donations, they need approval of the Minister for Stewardship & Engagement.
