

EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF ST. MARY OF EGYPT | EGYPT, FOURTH-FIFTH CENTURY

THIS EUCHARISTIC **MIRACLE IS RELATED IN THE** LIFE OF ST. MARY **OF EGYPT WHO LIVED IN THE DESERT FOR 47** YEARS. THE **ACCOUNT OF HER** LIFE WAS WRITTEN BY THE BISHOP **SOFRONIO OF JERUSALEM IN THE** 7TH CENTURY. ST. **MARY IS SAID TO HAVE WALKED ON** THE JORDAN RIVER **TO REACH THE OPPOSITE BANK AND RECEIVE COMMUNION** FROM THE MONK Zosimus.

We are told that when St. Mary was 12 years of age she left her parents and went to Alexandria. There she led a very dissolute life for 16 years. One day she came upon a ship about to set sail with different groups of passengers. She inquired who they might be and where they were going. She was told they were pilgrims sailing toward Jerusalem for the feast of the Exaltation of the Cross. She decided to join them. When on the feast day she tried to enter the church, she was seized by a mysterious force. Fearfully she raised her eyes to an image of the Holy Virgin and was overcome with a deep sorrow for the sinful life she had led until that day. Only then was she able to make her way into the church and worship the True Cross.

She did not remain in Jerusalem. "If you go across the Jordan you will find peace" was the message of the Madonna. The following day after her confession and Communion she made her way across the Jordan to the desert of Arabia.

There she lived for 47 years in solitude encountering neither men nor beasts. Her skin shriveled, her hair was long and white, but the promise of the Virgin proved true, she found her peace of soul.

One day she met up with the Monk Zosimus and asked him to bring her Communion each year. One year Zosimus arrived with the Eucharist, but Mary did not show. In great sorrow Zosimus prayed: "Lord, my God, King and Creator of all, do not deprive me of my desire, but grant that I may see this holy woman." Then he thought, "Now what will I do if she appears, there is no boat around to get me across? I will not achieve my wish." While he gave into these thoughts, Mary appeared on the opposite shore and Zosimus was consoled. Then he saw her make the sign of the Cross over the water and walk out on it as though it were dry land. When 12 months had passed Zosimus returned but was unable to find the mummified remains of the saintly penitent. A lion had dug her grave and buried the body.

PURIFICATION OF THE SACRED VESSELS





WHAT IS A 'CIBORIUM?'

A ciborium is a chalice-like vessel used to contain the Blessed Sacrament. The term was also applied in early Christian times to the canopy that surmounted and crowned the altar, but according to modern liturgical usage the word denotes exclusively the sacred vessel employed for the reservation of the Blessed Sacrament.

At the present day, two vessels are used to reserve the Blessed Sacrament: one, called a 'pyx,' is a small round box and serves for carrying the Blessed Sacrament to the sick; the other, generally styled a 'ciborium,' is used for distributing Holy Communion in churches and for reserving the consecrated particles in the tabernacle. In shape the ciborium resembles a chalice and provided with a conical cover surmounted by a cross or some other appropriate device. The material should be gold or silver, but the interior of the cup must be always lined with gold. The ciborium is not consecrated, but blessed by a bishop or some priest deputed by him, according to the form given in the Roman Ritual. While containing the Sacred Species it should be covered with small white veil of silk or cloth of gold, and should typically only be handled by sacred ministers, except when others are specially deputized to do so.

WHY DOES THE PRIEST OR DEACON 'TAKE SO LONG' TO PURIFY THE VESSELS AFTER COMMUNION?

Many have probably noticed that one of the lengthier parts of the Communion Rite actually occurs after everyone has received Communion. This action, known as the 'ablutions,' or 'purification of the vessels,' flows from our Catholic belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. We learn from the Catechism, that the whole Christ—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity—is present in even the smallest particle—the smallest crumb—of a consecrated host. Therefore, we must treat even these smallest particles as if they were a larger host.

So, at Mass, when you observe the priest or deacon taking his time with each and every 'ciborium' and chalice, it is because each of these is full of small particles which are difficult to see from the pews. The chalices, likewise, are still coated inside with the Precious Blood.

During the 'ablutions' (cleansings), the priest prays this prayer: "What has passed our lips as food, O Lord, may we possess in purity of heart, that what has been given to us in time may be our healing for eternity."

During this time of 'ritual cleansing' of the vessels, it is good for the priest, deacon, and, especially, the congregation to make prayers of adoration or thanksgiving to God for the precious gift they have received in the Holy Eucharist. Rather than seeing it as 'taking too long to wash the dishes,' we should use it as a moment of grace to grow in devotion to Our Lord.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The season of Lent is an important time for all the members of the Church to examine their lives and commitment to living their baptismal identity with renewed vigor. But for some people, the Catechumens, Lent has a

particularly intense character. Catechumens are those In the Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) who are preparing to be baptized. Lent is called the period of purification and enlightenment. It represents the weeks before baptism when the catechumens intensely prepare to renounce evil in their lives and to profess their faith in the Triune God. On the day they are baptized they will commit to live as a disciple of the Lord Jesus and to let everything they do be informed by the truths of the Gospel.

Each Lent, usually on the First Sunday of Lent, hundreds of men and women gather with their pastors or R.C.I.A. leaders and join the Archbishop for the Rite of Election. The Rite of Election is a liturgical celebration that recognizes the Church's decision, based on the recommendation of sponsors and pastors, to enroll each Catechumen in the Book of the Elect. By identifying them as a member of the "Elect," the Church is acknowledging that the person is ready to proceed on to receive the Sacraments of Initiation: baptism, confirmation and Holy Eucharist. Those already baptized, but planning to join the Church at Easter formally also attend the rite and answer a "call to continuing conversion" in these weeks of Lent. Twelve individuals in R.C.I.A. here at Ascension participated in that Rite of Election last weekend.

Lent invites all of us who are already baptized and members of the Catholic Church to imitate the catechumens and candidates in R.C.I.A. by reflecting deeply on our relationship with God and what He might be calling us to as His beloved sons and daughters. We are also encouraged during Lent to focus on strengthening our own commitment to our baptismal identity as disciples of Christ and members of His Church.

Please pray for our Catechumens preparing for baptism and for our Candidates seeking reception into full communion with the Church. May they and we, grow deeper in our knowledge and love of God this Lent and may that deepened connection with God help us to live lives that reflect ever-more closely our identity as children of God.





LENTEN DISCIPLINE: PRAYER

FROM A HOMILY BY SAINT JOHN CHRYSOSTOM BISHOP (SUPP. HOM. 6 DE PRECATIONE: PG 64, 462-466)

Prayer is the light of the spirit

Prayer and converse with God is a supreme good: it is a partnership and union with God. As the eyes of the body are enlightened when they see light, so our spirit, when it is intent on God, is illumined by his infinite light. I do not mean the prayer of outward observance but prayer from the heart, not confined to fixed times or periods, but continuous throughout the day and night.

Our spirit should be quick to reach out toward God not only when it is engaged in meditation; at other times also, when it is carrying out its duties, caring for the needy, performing works of charity, giving generously in the service of others, our spirit should long for God, and call him to mind, so that these works may be seasoned with the salt of God's love, and so make a palatable offering to the Lord of the universe. Throughout the whole of our lives we may enjoy the benefit that comes from prayer if we devote a great deal of time to it.



ST. JOHN CHRYSOSTOM (347-407)

Prayer is the light of the spirit, true knowledge of God, mediating between God and man. The spirit, raised up to heaven by prayer, clings to God with the utmost tenderness; like a child crying tearfully for its mother, it craves the milk that God provides. It seeks the satisfaction of its own desires, and receives gifts outweighing the whole world of nature.

Prayer stands before God as an honored ambassador. It gives joy to the spirit, peace to the heart. I speak of prayer, not words. It is the longing for God, love too deep for words, a gift not given by man but by God's grace. The apostle Paul says: We do not know how we are to pray but the Spirit himself pleads for us with inexpressible longings.

When the Lord gives this kind of prayer to someone; he gives him riches that cannot be taken away, heavenly food that satisfies the spirit. One who tastes this food is set on fire with an eternal longing for the Lord: his spirit burns as in a fire of the utmost intensity.

Practice prayer from the beginning. Paint your house with the colors of modesty and humility. Make it radiant with the light of justice. Decorate it with the finest gold leaf of good deeds. Adorn it with the walls and stones of faith and generosity. Crown it with the pinnacle of prayer. In this way you will make it a perfect dwelling place for the Lord. You will be able to receive him as in a splendid palace, and through his grace you will already possess him, his image enthroned in


