EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF BAGNO DI ROMAGNA | ITALY, 1412

In 1412, the then prior of the Basilica of St. Mary of Bagno di Romagna, Fr. Lazzaro da Verona, while celebrating the Holy Mass, was assailed by doubts about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament. He had just pronounced the words of consecration of the wine when this was transformed into living Blood and began to flow from the chalice and land on the corporal. Fr. Lazzaro, profoundly moved and repentant, confessed his unbelief to the faithful present at the celebration and the profound miracle that the Lord had worked before his eyes.





At Bagno di Romagna, in the Basilica of St. Maria Assumed, the relic of the Eucharistic miracle of the "Holy Cloth Soaked by Blood" is preserved. The historian Fortunio thus describes the miracle in his noted work Annales Camalduenses: "It was the year 1412. The Camoldese abbey of Santa Maria in Bagno (then Priorato) was governed by Don Lorenzo, of Venetian origin. While he was celebrating the Divine Sacrifice, his mind was occupied, by a diabolical work, with a strong doubt about the Real Presence of Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament; when he then saw the sacred species of the wine flow over the chalice and land on the corporal in the form of wine and living Blood, and thus the corporal remained soaked. It cannot be told how great was his emotion and perturbation of mind in that instant in the face of such a profound event. In tears he turned to the bystanders, confessing his unbelief and the miracle which now had taken place before his eyes." The monk Lazzaro was then transferred to Bologna as chaplain of the female Camaldolese convent of St. Christine, where he died in 1416. The Camoldese held the Parish of Bagno until the Napoleonic

suppression of 1808; from then the Parish - Basilica of St. Mary Assumed, after having been held for a brief period by the diocese of Sansepolcro, in 1975 passed definitively to become part of the diocese of Cesena. In 1912, Cardinal Gilio Boschi, Archbishop of Ferrara, celebrated the fifth centenary of the miracle, which was followed by a conference on Eucharistic studies. In 1958, His Excellency Domenico Bornigia, had a chemical analysis done on the marks of the corporal of the miracle at the University of Florence, which confirmed them to be of an ematic nature. In the basilica is found a colored and very rare incision on wood from 1400 called "The Madonna of the Blood," which is found in the third chapel on the left. This image is thus named because, as Benedetto Tenaci, abbot of Bagno and eye witness of the miracle on May 20, 1948, tells us, the icon bled from the left arm. Every year, during the Feast of Corpus Christi, the corporal is carried in procession through the streets of the city and is exposed on every Sunday of the temperate season which lasts from March to

ON HOLY COMMUNION DURING LENT

On Holy Communion During Lent by The Rt. Rev'd Dom Prosper Guéranger, O.S.B.

Of all the works, whereby a Christian can sanctify the time of Lent, there is none so pleasing to God as the assisting at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, in which is offered the Victim of man's salvation. But now that his own unworthiness is more than everevident to him, ought he to abstain from partaking, by Holy Communion, of this life-giving and purifying Host? Such is not our Saviour's will. He came down from heaven, not to judge, but to save us [St. John, iii. 17]. He knows how long and rugged is the road we have to traverse, before we reach that happy day, on which we shall rest with him, in the joy of his Resurrection. He has compassion on us; he fears lest we faint in the way [St. Matth. xv. 32]; and he, therefore, offers us the divine Food, which gives light and strength to our souls, and refreshes them in their toil. We feel that our hearts are not yet pure enough; let us, then, with an humble and contrite heart, go to him, who is come that he may restore to our souls their original beauty. Let us, at all times, remember the solemn injunction, which this Saviour so graciously deigned to give us: Except ve eat the Flesh of the Son of Man, ve shall not have life in you [St. John, vi. 54].

If, therefore, sin has no longer dominion over us; if we have destroyed it by true sorrow and sincere confession, made efficacious by the absolution of God's Priest; let us not deprive ourselves of the *Bread of Life* [St. John, vi. 35], no matter how great soever our infirmities may seem; for it is for us that our Jesus has prepared the Feast. If we feel that the chains of sin are still upon us; if by self-examination, made with the light of the Truth that is now granted to us, we discover in our souls certain stains, which the false principles of the world and too easy a conscience had hitherto made us wink at; let us lose no time, let us make a good Confession: and when we have made our peace with the God of mercy, let us approach the holy Table and receive the pledge of our reconciliation.

Yes, let us go to Holy Communion, during this season of Lent, with a most heart-felt conviction of our unworthiness. It may be, that hitherto we have sometimes gone with too much familiarity, on account of our not sufficiently understanding our nothingness, our misery, and the infinite holiness of the God, who thus unites himself with his sinful creatures. Henceforth, our heart shall be more truthful; blending together the two sentiments of humility and confidence, we will say, with an honest conviction, those words of the Centurion of the Gospel, which the Church puts upon our lips, when she is distributing to us the Bread of Life: Lord, I am not worthy that thou shouldst enter under my roof; say but the word, and my soul shall be healed [St. Matth. viii. 8].

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On this 4th Sunday of Lent many priests exercise the option of wearing rose colored vestments to commemorate Laetare Sunday. The title comes from the Latin word that begins

the entrance antiphon for the Mass today, "Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; exalt and be satisfied at her consoling breast." This change in vestment color indicates a brief reprieve from the rigors of Lent (for example flowers are allowed on the altar on this day) and offers a glimpse of the joy that awaits us at Easter, just before we enter into the somber days of Passiontide.

The first reading today tells the story of the Babylonian exile of the Jews around 590 BC. It implies that all the sufferings that came upon the Jews were the result of their infidelity to God, but God in all His mystery used a pagan king, Cyrus of Persia, as His instrument to restore the Jews to their homeland and rebuild their temple. It reveals, I believe, the fidelity of God even when His people are unfaithful. It reveals God's steadfast love for His people that endures and is salvific even when the people are weak in faith.

The Gospel passage from the third chapter of St. John's Gospel is one that is familiar to many. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him." The emphasis here is on God's fidelity, on His love for us.

Our Lenten focus is traditionally on our sins, on how we fail to honor God. But Lent should also cause us to focus on God's fidelity, God's merciful love offered to us sinners. A great remedy for sin is a keen awareness of just how much we are loved by God. We so often strive to avoid sin out of our sense of obedience or obligation. But a more powerful remedy for sin is the motivation of genuine love. If we really appreciate how much God loves us, we might try to avoid sin, not out of fear, but out of a desire to please the One who loves us.

Find time between now and Holy Week to reflect on how much God loves you. He gave you life, He sustains you daily, He blesses you with many good things and He came in the flesh, suffering humiliation, pain and finally death - all out of love for you. Better appreciating God's love for us can change us.
