

EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF WALLDURN GERMANY 1330

ONE OF THE MOST COMPLETE **DOCUMENTS ABOUT THE EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE IS TOLD** OF THE EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF WALLDURN GERMANY IN THE YEAR 1330 WAS WRITTEN BY THE MONK HOFFIUS IN 1589. DURING THE MASS A **PRIEST ACCIDENTALLY OVERTURNED THE SPECIES OF** THE CONSECRATED WINE ONTO THE CORPORAL IT THEN TRANSFORMED INTO BLOOD AND FORMED AN IMAGE ON THE CORPORAL OF THE **CRUCIFIED CHRIST. THE RELIC** OF THE CORPORAL WITH THE **BLOOD IS PRESERVED TODAY,** PLACED ON THE SIDE ALTAR IN THE MINOR BASILICA OF SAINT GEORGE IN WALLDURN. EVERY YEAR, SEVERAL THOUSANDS OF **PILGRIMS VISIT WALLDURN TO VENERATE THE SACRED RELIC**












The priest, Heinrich Otta, was celebrating the Holy Mass when he mistakenly overturned the chalice containing the species of the consecrated wine that had been transformed into the Blood of Christ. Immediately upon spilling, it formed on the corporal the image of the Crucified Christ, surrounded by eleven equal images of the head of Christ crowned with thorns. The priest did not have the courage to reveal the miracle and for many years he kept the corporal hidden under the altar. It was only near the point of his death, that he confessed then told the story of the event and revealed the corporal. From the beginning, the reliquary of the corporal has had much veneration, and many conversions and miraculous recoveries are attributed to this. Pope Eugene IV confirmed the miracle in 1445 and granted some indulgences. The miracle was famous across Europe and for centuries was depicted by many artists. The actual basilica was constructed between 1698 and 1728 by Franz Lothar von Schonborn, the Archbishop of Mainz. In 1962, Pope John XXIII elevated the church to a minor basilica. Augustinian monks have protected the basilica since 1938.

When we speak about the Eucharist, we have to focus on the essence of the liturgy, on the mystery of the Eucharist, and that this is Christ—the living Christ, our Incarnate God, who is really living with His mind, His heart, His soul, and His divinity in the sacrament of the Most Holy Eucharist. But in this mystery, He is veiled, as His divinity was veiled when He walked on the earth with His people, teaching and speaking with them. Since He was so simple and looked like an ordinary man—though the fullness of divinity was present in Him—many people did not recognize Him and rejected Him—the Pharisees, and scribes, and others—because of His humble appearance. Saint Paul says of Our Lord Jesus Christ, "He took the form of a servant, being made in the likeness of men, and in habit found as a man" (Phil 2:7).

In a deeper and more radical manner, the same happens in the mystery of the Eucharist, which is an extension of the Incarnation. The Incarnation is continued because now not only is Christ's divinity veiled by His humanity, but the Eucharistic species of bread and wine veil both the humanity and the divinity of Christ. Christ is veiled, but He continues to be the same; He lives here on earth in the same reality of His Incarnation, but in a different mode. It is now a sacramental mode. His humanity in the Eucharist is already a glorified humanity, but the glorified humanity is real and can be touched. When Christ rose from the dead He could be touched; He had a real but transfigured Body. The same is true of the Eucharist: His real body, real soul, and the whole plenitude of His divinity are veiled under the appearance of a small piece of bread.





This presents a continuous challenge to our faith, our love. We are challenged to renew our love for the Incarnation, by continually exercising our faith when we see the consecrated Host. This is our Incarnate God: et Verbum caro factum est: et habitavit in nobis, "and the Word was made flesh and dwelt amongst us" (Jn 1:14). And now He dwells among us even more deeply and more humbly and more mysteriouslyreally, in the same realistic way that He walked on the earth, but in another mode. It is real; that is why we speak of the Real Presence—I want to stress this point. This is our faith: that under the veil of the Eucharistic species of bread and wine, the plenitude of Our Lord's humanity and divinity is present. It should touch the deepest depths of our soul and provoke in us a corresponding attitude of soul and body, because this is the Incarnation. We cannot dispense with bodily signs of reverence and respect, because He is bodily present; the God-man is truly present. Concrete gestures of worship, adoration, and awe are the logical consequence of our faith.

When we diminish the exterior signs of awe, sacredness, and reverence, in time it quasi-necessarily diminishes our faith in the Real Presence of Our Lord and in His Incarnation. These are connected. Every time we diminish our respect and our awareness of the presence of Christ in the sacrament of the Eucharist—the real, full, substantial, and divine Presencewe diminish at the same time our faith in the Incarnation itself. Faith in the Eucharist and faith in the Incarnation are inseparably linked. Thus, it is a continuous act of faith in the Incarnation and in the supernatural because it is supernatural, because the divinity is so close to us. In the sacrament of the Eucharist Our Lord deigned to veil Himself beneath these external, weak elements of matter. There is nowhere in the entire world, in the entire history of the world, in the entire universe, where God is so close, where the divinity is as close to His creatures, as in the mystery of the Eucharist.

PASTOR'S CORNER

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The Old Covenant, the covenant that God made with Moses at Mt. Sinai, involved a long list of external practices that were meant to change how people lived, to

turn them from the ways of the world to God's way. As the "chosen people", the Jews were supposed to give witness to the world of justice and righteousness, so that all the nations might be drawn to the God of Israel.

St. Paul tells us that the Old Covenant Law revealed man's sinfulness and lack of fidelity to the Lord. Israel failed repeatedly to remain faithful to God. God allowed the consequences of their sinfulness to bring pain and suffering on Israel. While the most devout groups put much effort into reading, studying and practicing the minutia of the Law, they failed to let the Law transform their hearts. But God is faithful. Where we fall short, His grace provides.

The first reading today from the Prophet Jeremiah announces that "The days are coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their fathers..." What is this new covenant that God's word is announcing?

The new covenant involves a law written on our hearts. It is a covenant ushered in by the sacrifice of Jesus, evidenced by His words at the Last Supper, "This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood" (Lk 22:20). The Letter to the Hebrews makes reference to this and calls it "the blood of the eternal covenant."

Unlike the old covenant that has an external code to adhere to, the new covenant will have an internal law, what the *Catechism* calls the "interior law of charity" (CCC1965). Jeremiah says it best: "I will put my law within them, and I will write it upon their hearts" (Jer 31:33 RSV).

The difference between old and new is the way God interacts with us. The old law was only able to show us how unrighteous we were because we could not live up to it, but under the new law of love, the Holy Spirit comes to live within us an enable us by grace to live out God's calling.

RESPECT LIFE CORNER | UNDER ATTACK

Startling! In February, the Family Research Council (FRC) issued a report indicating attacks on churches have reached an all-time high and span all 50 states and the District of Columbia. These incidents follow a similar track in which the purpose appears to be to intimidate Christians and wound their religious sensibilities. Given a perceived increase in acts of hostility against churches in the U.S., FRC elected to analyze publicly available data to better understand the issue and to determine if there were any statistically significant recent increases. Their most recent report covers the period form 2018-2023. Their findings suggest that the rise in hostility identified in their December 2022 report has not slowed, nor plateaued but actually accelerated. The report documented more than 430 incidents in 2023, double the figure for 2022. The incidents included vandalism, arson, bomb threats, gun-related incidents and interruption of services. No matter what has driven these many acts, Arielle Del Turco, with FRC, writes "... American culture appears increasingly hostile to Christianity." While it is natural for congregants to feel disturbed and upset by these wanton acts, the free exercise of religion is an essential component of our society. Any attempts to prevent religious exercise through threats or violence must be vigorously condemned. 


