Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia! Happy Easter! He is risen! The whole Church rejoices as we celebrate the most hopefilled truth of our Christian faith. God so loved the word that he sent his only begotten Son to save us from the eternal



consequence of sin. Jesus, the Word of God made flesh, through His saving sacrifice on the Cross has reconciled humanity to God. In rising from the dead, Jesus became the principle and source of our own future resurrection. Through the Easter miracle we are confident that, not only our souls can be saved, but our bodies too can have eternal life in the resurrection of the dead.

At the Easter Vigil, the first celebration of Easter that occurs during the night, we heard these amazing words proclaimed:

> "Rejoice, let Mother Church also rejoice... Our birth would have been no gain, had we not been redeemed. O wonder of your humble care for us! O love, O charity beyond all telling, to ransom a slave, you gave away your Son! O truly necessary sin of Adam, destroyed completely by the Death of Christ! O happy fault that earned so great, so glorious a Redeemer!"

Easter, and the holy days that preceded it, should reassure each of us of the blessing we have in Christ Jesus. How precious you are in God's eyes. Yes, you, sinner though you are! "While we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Rom 5:8). Without the truth of Jesus' saving death and resurrection, life has no real meaning. What hope would we have of anything beyond the grave was it not for God's love revealed in Jesus Christ, the One who overcame death by rising from the grave? Even man's rebellion against his creator, expressed in the "original sin" of our first parents, has, by the mystery of God's love, earned for us "so great, so glorious a Redeemer."

Let the truth about God's love revealed in Christ's passion, death and resurrection give us the faith to "not be afraid" and to rejoice in the Resurrection. Happy Easter!

ON HOLY THURSDAY 1417, A PEASANT STOLE A **CONSECRATED HOST, WHICH IN** THE COURSE OF HIS JOURNEY **ESCAPED FROM HIS HANDS** AND FLEW AWAY IN THE AIR. HE TRIED IN VAIN TO CATCH IT. IT WAS ONLY THANKS TO THE **DIRECT INTERVENTION OF THE BISHOP THAT HE WAS ABLE TO RECOVER THE PARTICLE.** A **CHAPEL WAS IMMEDIATELY BUILT ON THE SITE WHERE THE** MIRACLE OCCURRED. THERE WERE MANY CURES AND WONDERS ATTRIBUTED TO THE VENERATION OF THIS MIRACLE.

Relic of the Holy Blood

Sanctuary of the Most Precious Blood

A poor peasant of Erding could find no way to improve his economic state, despite working many hours every day. His neighbor on the other hand, who did the same work, succeeded in living prosperously. One day the peasant asked his neighbor how he had succeeded in earning so much and the man confided to him that his success was owed to the fact that he kept the Blessed Sacrament in his house. The poor peasant, ignorant in the faith thought that the Blessed Sacrament was a type of amulet, and decided to imitate his neighbor. He went to Mass on Holy Thursday and after having received Communion, hid the Host in his clothes and left the church with It. During his journey, however, his conscience began to accuse him, so he decided to bring the particle back. During the trip, however, the Host slipped from his hand and disappeared in the air. He searched everywhere, without finding It. Terrorized by what had happened, he immediately ran to inform the pastor, who immediately went to the spot

where the Host had disappeared. As soon as he arrived the priest saw the particle resting on a clump of dirt, emitting a bright light. He approached to pick It up, and It again flew up in the air and disappeared. The priest alerted the Bishop who wanted to go in person to the site of the miracle. And again the Particle flew up in the air. The Bishop and the townspeople then decided to build a chapel in honor of the Eucharistic Wonder. There were so many crowds of pilgrims that flocked there that in 1675, local authorities decided to construct a new and bigger sanctuary in the baroque style. On Sept 19, 1677, Bishop Kaspar Kunner of Freising blessed the new church, which was dedicated to the Most Precious Blood. Various relics were brought to the sanctuary among which was that of the Most Precious Blood of Christ. Since 1992 the sanctuary has been under the care of the monks of St. Paul of the Desert.

Eucharistic Revival

ON HOLY COMMUNION DURING PASCHALTIDE

by The Rt. Rev'd Dom Prosper Guéranger, O.S.B.

In Passiontide, the Christian went to holy Communion impressed with these words of the Apostle: 'As often as ye shall eat this Bread, and drink the Chalice, ye shall show the death of the Lord.' He united himself with the divine Victim immolated for the sins of the world, and he died with his Saviour. During Paschal Time, the heavenly Food produces its effects in another manner; it fortifies the life of the soul, and gives to the body the germ of immortality. It is true that in each season of the liturgical year this twofold effect is produced in those who worthily receive Communion, namely, immolation and resurrection; but as, during the days consecrated to the Passion, the application of the mystery of immolation and sacrifice is more direct and more in accordance with the sentiments of the communicant, so also, during Paschal Time, the divine contact of the Body of our risen Jesus makes us feel, in a way that Easter alone can do, that to the holy Eucharist we owe the future resurrection of our bodies.

Our Savior himself teaches us this, where he says: 'Your fathers did eat manna in the desert, and are dead. This is the Bread which cometh down from heaven, that if any man eat of it, he may not die . . . He that eateth my Flesh, and drinketh my Blood, hath everlasting life, and I will raise him up in the last day.'

We shall all resume these bodies of ours on the Last Day, either for glory or punishment eternal; but he that worthily unites himself by holy Communion with the glorious and risen Body of the Man-God contracts an alliance and intimacy with him which forbid this divine Guest to leave in corruption these members made his own by the sublime Mystery.

We must, therefore, approach the holy altar during Eastertide with an ardent ambition for our resurrection, knowing as we do that we then receive into our bodies an element which is to



preserve them even when turned into dust; and which, moreover, confers on them a right to the qualities of glorified bodies, whose beauty and happiness will be like those of Our Lord, after he had risen from the grave.

Now, if our Redeemer does all this for our bodies by means of holy Communion—giving them, by it, the pledge of immortality what must he not do for our souls, in order to strengthen and increase within them that 'new life,' that Resurrection-life, which is the fruit of Easter, the object of all our past efforts, the reward of all the victories we have gained over ourselves during the



campaign of Lent? Nay, unless this new life be fostered by frequent Communion, it is in danger of growing weak, perhaps even of becoming extinct within us. The Apostle tells us that 'Christ, having risen from the dead, dieth now no more;' we, then, must die no more, for we are risen with him. To this end, we must hunger after the Bread of Heaven, of which Our Lord says: 'If any man eat of this Bread, he shall live for ever.'

FEAST OF THE ANNUNCIATION

Why didn't we celebrate the Feast of the Annunciation on March 25th this year?

On March 25, 9 months before Christmas, every year the Annunciation to Mary is remembered as a solemnity or very special feast day. It is on this day that Jesus became incarnate (flesh) in the womb of the Virgin Mary, after she consented. The fact of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary is related in Luke 1:26-38. It is sometimes called "Little Christmas."

Date of the Annunciation is Moved in 2024

However, since March 25 is the Monday of Holy Week, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord is transferred to Monday, April 8 [The next available day following the Easter Octave]. This special week remembers the sufferings of Jesus before his death and the Easter celebration; so they take precedence over the Annunciation. In some countries, the Annunciation is a Holy Day of obligation meaning you have to attend Holy Mass (no longer in the USA or Canada).





Areas of Pastoral Focus (as referenced in canons 528-529 of the Code of Canon Law)


- Liturgical formation of parishioners and fostering participation in the liturgical life of the parish




