Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Happy Easter! On this Sunday in the octave of Easter, the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday. Our parish will have a Divine Mercy Holy Hour on Sunday April, 7th at 3pm in the church. Confessors will also be available from 2pm until the beginning of the 5pm Mass.

St. Pope John Paul II established this feast for the whole of the Catholic Church on the occasion of the canonization of Sr. Faustina Kowalska on 30 April 2000. Sr. Faustina, now Saint Faustina, was a Polish nun who died in 1938 and who reported having visions of and conversations with Jesus. She recorded the content of these visions in her diary. From the diary of this young Polish nun, a special devotion began spreading throughout the world in the 1930s.

The message is nothing new, but is a reminder of what the Church has always taught through scripture and tradition: that God is merciful and forgiving and that we, too, must show mercy and forgiveness. But in the Divine Mercy devotion, the message takes on a powerful new focus, calling people to a deeper understanding that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone — especially the greatest sinners. God wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy.

The Church grants an indulgence for participation in the Divine Mercy devotion. May God's infinite mercy, that we celebrated during Holy Week and that we continue to rejoice in during the Easter Season, be a healing balm for your soul.

EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF SAINT-ANDRÉ DE LA RÉUNION | 1902

ON JANUARY 26, 1902, AT THE PARISH CHURCH OF SAINT-ANDRÉ, A CITY ON THE ISLAND OF LA RÉUNION (FRENCH COLONY), ABBOT HENRY LACOMBE, PASTOR OF THE **CHURCH, WAS WITNESS TO** THE MIRACLE THAT HE WOULD **RECOUNT TO THOUSANDS OF** PEOPLE DURING THE **EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS OF** ANGOULEME (1904), AS WELL AS TO THE GROUP OF PRIESTS **GATHERED FOR A SPIRITUAL RETREAT IN THE TOWN OF** PERIGUEUX. THE FACE OF JESUS APPEARED IN THE HOST WHICH WAS FOR MANY HOURS WITNESSED BY THOUSANDS OF PEOPLE.

et's look at report: It was January 26, 1902. We were celebrating perpetual adoration (the Forty hours). The Most Holy Sacrament was exposed in the tabernacle. I began to celebrate the Mass. After the elevation, at the moment of the Our Father, my eyes were lifted toward the Host and I saw a bright halo around the rays of the to recite the prayers of the Mass, with great agitation in my soul but which I tried to overcome. looked toward the monstrance. This time I saw a human face. with lowered eyes and a crown of thorns on the forehead. What moved me the most was the dolorous expression painted on the face. The eye- lashes were long and thick. I tried not to let on to the presence of the turmoil agitating inside of me. After Mass, I went to the sacristy and summoned the older children from the choir to go to the altar and closely observe the monstrance. The children raced back and told me: "Father, we see the head of a man in the Host. It is the good Lord revealing Himself! I understood then that the vision was authentic". A young man of 16, Adam de Villiers, who had studied in a college in France, also arrived. I said to him as well: "Go in the church and see if you notice something strange in the tabernacle". The young student went to the sacristy and returned immediately, saying: "Father, it is the good Lord who appears in the Host, I see His divine face". Since then, all my doubts disappeared. Slowly the entire town went to the church to see the miracle. Journalists and people from the capital of Saint Denis also arrived. The face on the Host suddenly became animated and the crown of thorns disappeared. I used every possible precaution, and fearing the effects from the rays of light, I had all the candles extinguished and the shutters closed. The phenomenon became even more clear. There was a young artist among the visitors who faithfully reproduced the face in the Host. Later, the vision changed again and a crucifix appeared which covered the entire Host from top to bottom. After the Eucharistic blessing and recital of the Tantum Ergo, the vision disappeared.

THE 40 HOURS DEVOTION

Coming to Ascension April 28, 29, and 30!

The 40 Hours Devotion is a special forty-hour period of continuous prayer made before the Blessed Sacrament in solemn exposition. Of course, the focus of this devotion is on the Holy Eucharist. As Catholics, the words of our Lord burn in our hearts: "I myself am the living bread come down from Heaven. If anyone eats this bread, He shall live forever; the bread I will give is my flesh for the life of the world."

Affirming our belief in the Real Presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, the Vatican Council II taught that the Holy Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life" ('Lumen Gentium,' #11). While the Mass is the central act of worship for us Catholics, an act which participates in the eternal reality of our Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection, Vatican Council II upheld and encouraged the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament outside of Mass. Of course, such devotion derives from the Sacrifice of the Mass and moves the faithful to both sacramental and spiritual communion with our Lord. Pope John Paul II repeatedly "highly recommended" public and private devotion of the Blessed Sacrament, including processions on the Feast of Corpus Christi and the 40 Hours Devotion.

The practice of the 40 Hours Devotion originated in Milan about the year 1530. In 1539, Pope Paul III responded to a petition from the Archdiocese of Milan granting an indulgence for the practice. While this pronouncement seems to be the earliest official approval by the Church of this devotion, the 40 Hours

RESPECT LIFE CORNER | DEFENDING RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

Recently, in Texas, a senior housing complex prohibited a resident-run bible study/prayer gathering in its community room. A resident contacted the American Center for Law and Justice (ACLJ) seeking assistance. The ACLJ, a prolife organization that defends religious freedom and free speech worldwide, sent the housing complex a letter demanding they cease their unlawful conduct. The demand drew a prompt response assuring them that the resident could continue using the community room for weekly Bible study and prayer meetings. A unique occurrence? Sadly, no. The ACLJ has seen a number of these type actions by senior living centers across the country. The centers' rationale for the prohibitions appears to be that they are the recipients of federal funds and must prohibit residents form hosting Bible studies. The opposite is true. These facilities are actually prohibited from discriminating against this type of religious use when other uses are permitted. The ACLJ, and several other prominent groups, are committed to confronting and responding to these not so subtle attacks on religious liberty.


