



FATHER GARY PENNINGS PASTOR'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We continue a four-part homily series on the Eucharist and chapter 6 of John's Gospel. This weekend we will explore the Eucharist as Communion.

St. Peter tells us that through Christ's own glory and goodness we can "become participants of the divine nature" (2 Pet 1:4). St. Thomas Aquinas said it another way, "The only begotten Son of God, wishing to enable us to share in his divinity, assumed our nature so that becoming man he might make men gods." The first line of the Prologue to the Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness, freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life."

The divinization of man and woman does not mean that man becomes God, but that man and woman might become transformed into the full image and likeness of God. Sin diminishes that image and likeness. Through the gift of sanctifying grace and supernatural love, that likeness begins to be restored.

When we receive Christ in the Eucharist, we call it "Holy Communion". St. Augustine reasoned that the word communion came from the roots com, meaning "with, together" and unus, meaning "oneness, union." So, communion means to come together as one.

Throughout our Catholic Tradition, this becoming one with Our Lord in the Eucharist has always had nuptial overtones. In one sense the Incarnation (God becoming man) was ordered to accomplish a mystical marriage between the Bride, the Church (the Mystical Body of Christ), and Christ Jesus, the Lamb of God and Bridegroom (the head of that Mystical Body). Jesus Himself used wedding imagery in the parables to depict this nuptial union.

The Church remains in an "already, but not yet" reality. We are the Bride of Christ, but we are exiled in this world. How can this "marriage" be consummated with the Bride in exile? The Eucharist is the answer the Lord provides. In Heaven, there will be no need for the Sacrament, for the consummation will be fully realized.



The Holy Eucharist is the supreme sacrifice of the New Covenant rooted in Christ's sacrificial offering on the Cross. The Eucharist is both a sacrament and a true sacrifice where Christ's one sacrifice of the Cross is made present in a sacramental manner at each Mass. This means that during the Eucharistic celebration, the same sacrifice of Calvary is re-presented, not repeated—allowing the faithful to participate in Christ's redemptive act.

The Eucharistic sacrifice is unique in that it is an un-bloody offering—distinguishing it from the bloody sacrifice of the Cross while retaining its essence and efficacy. This sacrificial aspect is central to the Eucharist's role as a means of grace—offering the faithful a profound union with Christ's redemptive work. Through the Eucharist, believers are drawn into the mystery of Christ's death and resurrection—sharing in the benefits of His sacrifice.

The Eucharistic sacrifice is a fulfillment of the Old Testament sacrifices, which were mere foreshadowings of the perfect sacrifice of Christ. In the Mass, the Church offers the Eucharist to the Father—joining in Christ's eternal self-offering. This sacrificial offering is not only an act of worship but also a source of spiritual nourishment and strength for the faithful—deepening their communion with God and one another.

The Eucharist is the living sacrifice of Christ perpetually offered in the Church and as the means by which the faithful are united to the saving work of Christ on the Cross.

A Transformational Encounter with Christ: Melissa Joerger's Pilgrimage at the National Eucharistic Congress



In the heart of Indianapolis, the National Eucharistic Congress gathered nearly 60,000 faithful participants for an event that would leave a lasting impact on attendees, including Melissa Joerger. The Congress, an assembly of Catholics from across the nation, brought together a diverse crowd for a shared purpose: to deepen their relationship with Christ through the Eucharist. Melissa, like many, approached the Congress with expectations of a powerful and enriching experience. However, the event proved to be more life-changing than she had anticipated. "I knew it would be big," Melissa shared. "I knew it would be powerful, but had no idea it would be as life-changing as it was."

The Congress featured a range of activities designed to engage and inspire attendees. Large evening revival sessions, morning impact sessions, and breakout discussions provided ample opportunities for learning and reflection. The event also included testimonies, Eucharistic Adoration, a Eucharistic Procession, Mass, Reconciliation, speakers, music and worship, all of which Melissa found to be profoundly moving. One of the most striking aspects of the Congress was the significant presence of religious and clergy. With over 1,170 priests, 1,200 religious brothers and sisters, 610 seminarians, and 200 bishops in attendance, Melissa was awed by the collective display of faith. "It was absolutely stunning," she noted. While the grandeur of the event was undeniably impactful, some of Melissa's most cherished memories came from smaller, more intimate encounters. Conversations with fellow attendees during bus rides, elevator waits, and walks between events offered insights into the diverse motivations and hopes of those present. "Hearing their stories, why they were there, what they were hoping to take away, what fruits they already have been given," she recalled, were powerful moments of connection and shared purpose.

Amidst the vast sea of attendees, one of the most profound experiences for Melissa occurred during Eucharistic Adoration. Surrounded by thousands of pilgrims, she observed a shared hunger, thirst, faith, and, most importantly, hope. "With all the evil in the world lately that is constantly seeking to divide us and beat us down, I felt so much hope knowing I was among 60,000 people seeking Christ with all our hearts," Melissa reflected. "There was one particular evening when benediction was occurring. I was watching the procession and at the same time noticed the sun was setting and started to peek through one of the upper windows in the stadium. At the very moment that the monstrance was placed on the altar, a large sun ray illuminated it. It was absolutely breathtaking. There was no doubt that Jesus was present with us." The Congress concluded with a call to action: to "Walk With One." This mission urges participants to accompany someone who has fallen away from the faith or lacks a relationship with Jesus, guiding them to understand the Eucharist as the Source, Summit, and Sustenance of their spiritual lives. Melissa left the Congress inspired and committed to this mission, embodying the spirit of a Eucharistic people on a shared journey of faith.



RESPECT FOR LIFE CORNER: THE FENCER AND THE ARCHER

Nada Hafez, an Egyptian fencer, competed in the two previous Olympics. But in Paris she reached the round of 16. Reflecting, she said ".. pride fills my being for securing my place in the round of 16!" Following her last match, she announced: "What appears to you as two players on the podium, they were actually three!" She wrote: "It was me, my competitor, and my yet to come to our world little baby"! While demanding physically and emotionally, at 7 months, she it said was worth it to have been an Olympian three times and then this time to be "carrying a little Olympian one!" The responses to her announcement were overwhelming and are best summarized by one commentator: "What an extraordinary woman!"..

Within a day of Hafez's announcement, Yaylagul Ramazanova, who was 6 ½ months pregnant and representing Azerbaijan, competed in her archery event. She commented: "I felt my baby kick me before I shot this last arrow, and then I shot a 10." She said the baby gave her strength and luck. In training she "felt that she was not fighting alone, but fighting together with my baby." American archer Casey Kaufhold was inspired by her fellow archer. She said: "I think it's awesome for this archer that one day, she can tell her kid, 'Hey, I went to the Olympic Games and you were there, too."" For those who deny the humanity of the unborn, the testimony of these women confronts their denial of science.
