



FATHER GARY PENNINGS PASTOR'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In today's first reading from the Book of Deuteronomy, we hear Moses speaking to the Israelites about God's law. He equates wisdom and intelligence with adherence to Divine Law, to the norms of God.

We should heed Moses' words. In our day, many seem to think that religion, faith, or even speaking of God's Law somehow implies superstition or lack of critical thinking. People of faith are often depicted in the media and in entertainment as gullible and simple-minded. Such elitist attitudes can lead to a spiritually dangerous pride that threatens not only individual wellbeing, but familial and societal wellbeing as well.

Moses goes on to speak of great nations as those that have laws that are just and that have faith in a God in whom they can call upon for help (Dt 4:7-8). As citizens and Christians, we should exercise our political responsibility to promote civil governance that is rooted in the natural law, in genuine justice, and that respects the truths of human dignity, responsibility, and true freedom revealed in God's word.

The second reading from the Letter of James reminds us to "be doers of the word [of God] and not hearers only", for to speak of God's word, but not strive to live it, leads to self-delusion and causes scandal to those who observe us.

In the Gospel for today, Jesus, speaking to the Scribes and Pharisees reminds us that our growth in respect for God's Law begins in our own hearts. He warns, as St. James did above, to not be hypocritical in how we conduct our lives and exhorts us not to honor God with our lips, while having our hearts far from Him.

Christians are called to embrace the truths revealed by God, truths about God, about the purpose of life, and about who we are and what God's Law calls us to do. We are also called to live those truths and in doing so, to find true wisdom and true intelligence that will better serve us as individuals, as families and as a nation.

PARISH TOPICS



In our last segment of the Eucharistic homily series, we considered the topic of 'mission.' Just as manna was provided to the Israelites in the desert as sustenance for their journey to the Promised Land, the Eucharist serves as our spiritual nourishment throughout our earthly pilgrimage toward the eternal promised land of heaven. In partaking of the Eucharist, we are united with Christ's Body and Blood, drawing us closer to His Mystical Body, the Church. During Mass, we invoke the Holy Spirit to transform the offerings of bread and wine, as well as to transform the faithful into the unified Body of Christ, offered back to God both in liturgical worship and through the witness of our daily lives. Through receiving the Eucharist, we are empowered to offer ourselves more deeply and in a more Christ-like manner to the Father, perfecting the movement of sacrifice and fostering a more profound communion with Him.


The Eucharistic nature of the Christian life extends beyond participation in Mass and devotion to the Blessed Sacrament; it encompasses a willingness to trust in the sanctifying grace of the sacrament and to remain docile to the Holy Spirit's work in our everyday experiences. Pope Benedict XVI emphasized that a "Eucharistic life is one lived according to the Spirit," calling us to live in transforming grace that enables us to reflect Christ in all our thoughts, words, and actions. True worship, therefore, permeates every aspect of our existence, extending beyond church walls and Sunday services to consecrate the world itself to God through holy activity. Both the common priesthood of the laity and the ministerial priesthood of the clergy share in the collaborative mission of building God's kingdom, joining together in offering the Eucharist. In becoming a living sacrifice, we lift up our offerings and are filled with every grace and heavenly blessing, answering the call and receiving the grace to live our lives as an eternal offering. This invitation involves sharing in Christ's compassion for our own wounds and the sufferings of others, participating both externally and internally in His redemptive work.

Living on mission means embracing an intentional life for Christ, where grace-filled choices evolve into habits of virtue, guiding us toward our ultimate destination of heaven and the fulfillment of our purpose in achieving sainthood. The Eucharist offers particular graces that nourish us in charity, increase our faith and hope, and strengthen our responsiveness to the Holy Spirit. In this sacred sacrament, we are intimately connected with Christ, fulfilling God's deepest desire for a personal relationship with each of us within the temple of our hearts. As we are nourished by His Body and Blood, we pray to be filled with the Holy Spirit and become "one body, one spirit in Christ," embodying His presence in the world and continuing His mission of love and redemption.

With each new challenge we thank God for generously instilling in us the confidence that the Holy Spirit will guide us and provide sufficient workers for the vineyard. God's vineyard is vast and extends well beyond the four walls of Ascension. We have been called to serve Jesus to our parishioners at Mass as well as those who are unable to join us.

We truly believe that serving as an Extra Ordinary Minister of Holy Communion is a calling. It is not a check the box ministry, nor is it for everyone. That being said, each of us has the responsibility to search our souls and truly listen for the "whisper" that is God's voice. He is calling you to belief in the Real Presence and to serve even when the load and responsibility seems a little too heavy. He is providing you a pathway to your eternal reward. Dan Eliason's Experience: Immersed in Faith and Unity at the National **Eucharistic Congress**



For Dan Eliason, attending the 10th National Eucharistic Congress was a spiritual and deeply personal journey, one that brought him closer to his faith and his fellow Catholics. Although he arrived late in the week, on Friday, July 19th, his experience of the Congress was no less powerful or transformative. From moments of profound silence to lively celebrations, Dan found himself deeply moved by the unity and reverence that characterized the event.

One of Dan's first encounters was during a Revival session on Friday evening at Lucas Oil Stadium. As he joined over 60,000 other Catholics, he was struck by the sight of so many gathered in worship. The evening's speakers, including Sister Josephine Garrett and Fr. Boniface Hicks, OSB, offered powerful reflections on God's purpose and our diversity as His children. Yet, it was the Eucharistic procession that left an indelible mark on Dan's heart. As Fr. Hicks carried the monstrance through the stadium, a sacred hush fell over the crowd. The reverence was palpable, as 60,000 people knelt in unison, praying and adoring Christ in the Eucharist. In that moment, Dan witnessed something extraordinary—people reaching out to touch the priest's robe, just as in the Gospel of Mark, where the woman reached out in faith to be healed by Jesus.

Saturday brought new experiences as Dan explored the vast Exhibition Hall, an impressive space filled with hundreds of exhibits representing Catholic ministries, media outlets, and religious orders. He spent hours walking through the hall, absorbing the richness and diversity of the Church's mission. But the highlight of the day was the Eucharistic procession through the streets of downtown Indianapolis. Dan was struck by the sheer number of religious present seminarians, priests, deacons, and religious sisters-marching in joyful procession alongside tens of thousands of laypeople. When the Blessed Sacrament passed by, Dan joined the crowd, walking together as one Body of Christ.

The day concluded with another powerful revival session, led by Catholic musician Matt Maher. The energy in the stadium was electric as young people rushed to the stage to join in praise and worship. A special moment came when actor Jonathan Roumie, known for his portrayal of Jesus in The Chosen, delivered a reading from the Bread of Life discourse in the Gospel of John. His words left a deep impression on the crowd, drawing them closer to the heart of Christ.

On Sunday, the Congress culminated with a send-off Mass at Lucas Oil Stadium. The Mass was a vivid display of the universal Church, with Cardinal Luis Tagle delivering his homily in multiple languages to reflect the diversity of the attendees. As Dan witnessed 60,000 Catholics receive the Eucharist in a remarkably organized manner, he was filled with a sense of awe and gratitude for the unity and strength of the Church.

Dan left the Congress changed, pondering the question posed by Bishop Barron during the final session: "Where will Jesus take His Church from here, and how can I become a part of it?" Inspired by the example of Dorothy Day, Dan understood that his role, like that of all laity, was to help lead others toward spiritual growth—one person at a time, through the power of the Sacraments and, above all, the Eucharist.
