

FATHER GARY PENNINGS PASTOR'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Some people think that Christianity is just about rules and commandments. But the late Pope Benedict XVI clarified in his encyclical letter, Deus Caritas Est that "Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction."

The Pope goes on to say, "Saint John's Gospel describes that event in these words: 'God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should ... have eternal life' (3:16)". The late Holy Father reminds us that love is at the core of Christianity.

In today's Gospel passage, a scribe asks Jesus what the greatest commandment is. Jesus responds by saying: "love the Lord your God with all your heart, ...soul, ... mind, and ... strength" and "love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus Himself affirms love to be at the core of His teaching and of the Faith.

Personally, I see learning how to love rightly, to love in the way that Jesus wants us to love, as the greatest challenge in the Christian life. Because we are all sinners, to love rightly demands divine help. To love like Jesus means we must have our priorities right and we must be willing to deny ourselves and sacrifice for others.

This weekend, we launch our annual Stewardship Appeal. As a tithing parish, Ascension depends on every household doing their share in support of our parish, its apostolates, ministries and charitable outreach. The first commitment that is expected of one who claims Ascension as their parish is Sunday Mass attendance. Faithful worship at Mass is one of the best ways we show our love for God by honoring Jesus' command to "do this in memory of me."

To further fulfill the command to love God and neighbor, we are invited to "be doers of the word and not hearers only" (Jas 1:22). Each year parishioners of Ascension are invited to recommit to generously sharing their time, talent and treasure in support of the parish's work.

Please review the Stewardship Appeal materials that you will receive in the mail this week. It is an invitation to respond to the Lord's command to love.



Liz Willman has built a beautiful program for Adults that includes RCIA and the Adult Faith classes. I have been volunteering for over a decade. There are several of us who volunteer to lead these classes, and Liz always encourages us to find good, Catholic courses we are interested in to share with the parish each year. The classes all follow Catholic Doctrine and strive to help us all grow in our relationships with Jesus. Women and men of all ages come to our classes. Some know their faith well; others are just starting their journeys. The majority of classes offered do not require prior knowledge of the Faith or the Bible. For the rare occasions that you do need a little background, that will be stated clearly in the catalog description.

Our classes include reading, sometimes workbooks and videos, often small group discussion, and occasionally large group discussion. No one is ever forced to answer a question or speak to the class, but everyone is more than welcome to do just that. Each of us strives to create a warm, welcoming, non-threatening environment where everyone can relax and be themselves and learn at their own pace. This leads to another major benefit - fellowship and community. I have met so many wonderful people who have become friends and prayer partners. I have also watched friendships formed and strengthened throughout the classes. They often sign up together for more classes and even bring family, friends, and neighbors.





SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION (HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION) • DECEMBER 9

Monday, December 9 is a Holy Day of Obligation celebrating the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. After consultation with the Holy See, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has announced that whenever the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is transferred from Sunday, December 8 to Monday, December 9, it remains a holy day of obligation, beginning this year. This is a change of past practice, whereby the obligation to attend Mass was previously lifted with the transfer of the solemnity from Sunday to Monday. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception has always been transferred to Monday when December 8 has fallen on a Sunday. But from now on, the transfer includes the obligation of the faithful to attend Mass. The Roman Catholic Church in the United States is dedicated to the patronage of Mary under the title of her Immaculate Conception. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is therefore the patronal fest of the U.S. Church.

*Please Note: that if you attend the 5:00PM Mass on Sunday. December 8, this does NOT fulfill the obligation for the Holy Day. You must attend another Mass on Monday, December 9.

*You may attend a regular Sunday Mass on Sunday, December 8 AND attend the 5:00PM Sunday Mass. The 5:00Рм Mass would then fulfill your Holy Day obligation.

In 1882, Father Michael McGivney formed the Knights of Columbus in New Haven, CT. The goal of the group was to care for the poor and the widowed, to make its members better Catholics and better Americans, and to contribute to the spiritual and civic well-being of the church and the local communities of its members. It was a response, under Father McGivney's leadership, to the anti-Catholic sentiments and industrial abuses of the era in which he lived. McGivney contracted tuberculosis and eventually succumbed, at the age of 38, to the disease in August 1890. Widely mourned, his death did not signal the end of the Knights of Columbus, which because of its structure as a lay, fraternal organization (as devised by McGivney), could carry on its work after his death.


