

# FATHER GARY PENNINGS PASTOR'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The theme of this year's Stewardship Appeal is taken from the First Letter of St. Peter - "So, As We Have Received, We Give!"

Church of the Ascension has a long-standing custom of practicing biblical tithing.

Several places in the Scriptures call the People of God to recognize that all blessings come from God and that they should return a tenth of their blessings, crops, herds, wealth, etc. back to God.

While the Church does not demand that the Faithful practice the Old Testament biblical tithing model, all Catholics are encouraged to give generously and cheerfully (see 2 Cor. 9:7). The Church does, however, oblige the Faithful to assist in the Church's needs (see Canon 222).

In our modern world, it is common to allocate donations to churches or other charities from what is left over, from our excess wealth. But the Gospel passage today reveals a stark contrast between the large sums given by the rich and the mere two coins given by the poor widow. The Lord praises the poor widow for putting in more, because she did not give from her surplus wealth, but gave a sacrificial gift, one taken from her poverty. That is the attitude of a steward.

One of the blessings of Ascension Parish is that we do not depend on one or two wealthy families to sustain our parish. Instead, we invite all parishioners, rich or poor, to sacrificially give in accord with their ability. We expect all families to give a portion, the wealthy will give more, those of meager income will give less, but all participate. Thus, every household accepts responsibility for the work of the parish.

Stewardship, of course, is not just about money. All we do here at Ascension demands the generous gifting of parishioner's time and talent as they participate in ministries, volunteering their time and offering their services in support of our various apostolates. Good stewards share the most precious thing they have, themselves, in support of God's work.

Please review the Stewardship Packet that you received in the mail and prayerfully offer your gifts of time, talent and treasure in support of the Church's work here at Church of the Ascension.

# MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS Description: A state of the state of the



We are John and Melissa Joerger. We have been parishioners of Ascension for 21 years. We've been married for almost 26 years and have four children who attended Ascension school from K through 8th grade and are now ages 20-24 - all who are in college or graduate school. We've been very blessed to lead the Respect Life Ministry for approximately 11 years. When we took over as the coordinators, our family was pretty young, but it was such a beautiful ministry to do as a family, and our children refer to the experience many times when asked what helped shape their faith life.

We are both very passionate about life issues, but have had very different paths to make it something we wanted to devote our time and energy toward. John is a cradle Catholic, the second youngest of 11 siblings. He grew up in a very traditionally Catholic family that respected life at all stages, at all times without exception. That is what he was taught, and learned to believe and respect on his own as he became an adult. On the other hand, I am a convert, an only child, raised by a single mother as my father passed away when I was very young. My mom was quietly pro-choice. We didn't ever discuss it - so it wasn't really an issue for me until becoming an adult when I began wrestling with what I truly believe. When I joined the Catholic Church in 1997, the RCIA process educated me about the Church and Her teachings and the "why's" of everything. Going through NFP classes when we were engaged and understanding God's beautiful design and purpose of our bodies and human life really helped to cement my beliefs.

I feel very blessed that John and I have had such different pathways to get us to where we are as it allows us to have different perspectives as to how best to implement ideas and reach others. While leading the Respect Life Ministry, we've focused our time and energy on increasing awareness of life issues, educating parishioners about the issues and/or events and encouraging parishioners to get involved and take action. We recently decided to step back and give someone else an opportunity to lead this ministry. It has been such a blessing to us and we plan to stay very involved. As with most ministry work, it always seems as though so much more can and should be done. Protecting the dignity of LIFE is a broad issue - it is the foundation of all things as if we didn't have life, we would have nothing else!



## St. Ephrem the Syrian | Catholic Saints

An Eastern Father of the early Church, St. Ephrem the Syrian was arguably the most important saint and theological writer for the Syriac-speaking churches. He did not write many treaties or letters but devoted himself to writing hymns to God. # SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION (HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION) • DECEMBER 9

Masses: 7:00AM, 8:00AM (School Mass), 12:00PM and 7:00PM, Church

Monday, December 9 is a Holy Day of Obligation celebrating the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. After consultation with the Holy See, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has announced that whenever the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is transferred from Sunday, December 8 to Monday, December 9, it remains a holy day of obligation, beginning this year. This is a change of past practice, whereby the obligation to attend Mass was previously lifted with the transfer of the solemnity from Sunday to Monday. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception has always been transferred to Monday when December 8 has fallen on a Sunday. But from now on, the transfer includes the obligation of the faithful to attend Mass. The Roman Catholic Church in the United States is dedicated to the patronage of Mary under the title of her Immaculate Conception. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is therefore the patronal fest of the U.S. Church.

\*Please Note: that if you attend the 5:00PM Mass on Sunday, December 8, this does NOT fulfill the obligation for the Holy Day. You must attend another Mass on Monday, December 9.

\*You may attend a regular Sunday Mass on Sunday, December 8 AND attend the 5:00PM Sunday Mass. The 5:00PM Mass would then fulfill your Holy Day obligation.

The emblem of the Order dates from the second Supreme Council meeting on May 12, 1883, when James T. Mullen, who was then supreme knight, designed it. The emblem indicates a shield mounted upon the Formée cross. The shield is associated with a medieval knight. The Formée cross represents a traditional artistic design of the cross of Christ through which all graces of redemption were procured for mankind. This then represents the Catholic spirit of the Order. Mounted on the shield are three objects: a fasces (a bundle of rods bound together about an ax with the blade projecting) standing vertically and, crossed behind it, an anchor and a short sword. The fasces from Roman days, carried before magistrates as an emblem of authority, symbolize authority that must exist in any tightly-bonded and efficiently operating organization. The anchor is the mariner's symbol for Columbus, patron of the Order, while the short sword was the weapon of the Knight when engaged upon an errand of mercy. Thus, the shield expresses Catholic Knighthood in organized merciful action, and with the letters, K of C, it proclaims this specific form of activity.

# RESPECT FOR LIFE CORNER: **7 YEARS**

In a continuing legal saga dating from 2017, a coalition of Jews, Muslims, Christians, 20 states and legal scholars have asked the Supreme Court, in Diocese of Albany v. Adrienne A. Harris, to block a New York mandate that religious organizations provide abortion coverage for employees. When the abortion mandate was initially proposed, the state promised to exempt all employers with religious objections. However, after pressure from abortion activists, New York caved and limited the exemption to only religious groups that primarily teach religion and primarily hire and serve those who share their faith. Obviously, the exception does not apply to most religious ministries because they seek to serve all people regardless of their faith. Consequently, it would not extend to an order of Catholic nuns that serves the elderly and dying regardless of religious affiliation. "New York is bullying nuns into bankrolling abortions because they serve all people, no matter their faith," said Eric Baxter, senior counsel at Becket. He added, "That is unacceptable-as this outpouring of support shows, religious organizations should be free to care for the needy without having to violate their beliefs." (Sources: Numerous).


