FATHER GARY PENNINGS PASTOR'S CORNER



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

As we approach the end of the liturgical year (a new liturgical year will begin with the 1st Sunday of Advent), the scripture readings at Mass turn to endtimes themes, what is often termed, "apocalyptic" writings.

Today in the reading from the Book of Daniel, we hear of a "time of unsurpassed distress" and how "Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some shall live forever...". In the Gospel passage, we hear Jesus speak of days that are coming, days that will follow a great tribulation, and that will be accompanied by cosmic signs. Jesus says, "And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory...".

This passage is from Mark's version of what scholars have come to know as the "Olivet Discourse", a message delivered by Jesus on the Mount of Olives shortly before His crucifixion. In this discourse Jesus foretold two judgments. He predicts first a coming judgment upon Jerusalem including the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem – all of which is to take place soon, within one generation. The destruction of the Temple is a "prophetic sign" of the second judgment pronounced by Jesus: namely, the final judgment at the end of the world (see Mt 24: 1-31; Mark 13: 1-37).

We will hear these apocalyptic overtones from now through the First Sunday of Advent. The Church is preparing us to reflect, not only on the historical event of Christmas, when the Divine Word of God became flesh and was born in Bethlehem, but also to have us reflect on the Second Coming of the Lord, when He will return at the end of days to judge the living and the dead.

The Lord, Emmanuel, God with Us, came once to save us and to prepare us for His second coming, when He will usher in a New Heavens and a New Earth. The Season of Advent invites us to be watchful, to wait in joyful hope.

He IS coming, so be ready!



SOLEMNITY OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION (HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION) • DECEMBER 9

Masses: 7:00AM, 8:00AM (*School Mass*), 12:00PM and 7:00PM, *Church*

Monday, December 9 is a Holy Day of Obligation celebrating the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. After consultation with the Holy See, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has announced that whenever the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary is transferred from Sunday, December 8 to Monday, December 9, it remains a holy day of obligation, beginning this year. This is a change of past practice, whereby the obligation to attend Mass was previously lifted with the transfer of the solemnity from Sunday to Monday. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception has always been transferred to Monday when December 8 has fallen on a Sunday. But from now on, the transfer includes the obligation of the faithful to attend Mass. The Roman Catholic Church in the United States is dedicated to the patronage of Mary under the title of her Immaculate Conception. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception is therefore the patronal fest of the U.S. Church.

*Please Note: that if you attend the 5:00PM Mass on Sunday, December 8, this does NOT fulfill the obligation for the Holy Day. You must attend another Mass on Monday, December 9.

*You may attend a regular Sunday Mass on Sunday, December 8 AND attend the 5:00PM Sunday Mass. The 5:00PM Mass would then fulfill your Holy Day obligation.

DID YOU

The emblem of the Order dates from the second Supreme Council meeting on May 12, 1883, when James T. Mullen, who was then supreme knight, designed it. The emblem indicates a

shield mounted upon the Formée cross. The shield is associated with a medieval knight. The Formée cross represents a traditional artistic design of the cross of Christ through which all graces of redemption were procured for mankind. This then represents the Catholic spirit of the Order. Mounted on the shield are three objects: a fasces (a bundle of rods bound together about an ax with the blade projecting) standing vertically and, crossed behind it, an anchor and a short sword. The fasces from Roman days, carried before magistrates as an emblem of authority, symbolize authority that must exist in any tightly-bonded and efficiently operating organization. The anchor is the mariner's symbol for Columbus, patron of the Order, while the short sword was the weapon of the Knight when engaged upon an errand of mercy. Thus, the shield expresses Catholic Knighthood in organized merciful action, and with the letters, K of C, it proclaims this specific form of activity.


