### FATHER GARY PENNINGS PASTOR'S CORNER

#### **Merry Christmas!**

What is it all about? I mean Christmas - what's it all about?

The very first line of the Catechism of the Catholic Church answers that question when it states:

God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness, freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life... To accomplish this, when the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son as Redeemer and Savior. In his Son and through him, he invites [mankind] to become, in the Holy Spirit, his adopted children and thus heirs of his blessed life." (Catechism, paragraph 1)

That's what it is all about. It's about a God who so loves us that, despite the rejection of God by our first parents, He came to seek us and save us. In an act of "sheer goodness," i.e. pure love and compassion, God entered space and time to take on the limits of our humanity and to save us from ourselves. And the reason that God wants to save us is so that we might share in the very life of God – divine life!

Sound too good to be true? Well, it IS true! You are that special in God's eyes – yes, you! Despite your sins, despite your preoccupation with so many things that endanger your soul, despite how you so often resist true happiness and settle for a counterfeit "happiness," God came to seek your heart and to save you so that you might have a share in the very reality of God – His joy, His glory and His peace.

That is what Christmas is all about. If we really understand the true meaning of Christmas, how can we not respond by accepting the marvelous gift that God is offering us in Jesus Christ, the Word made flesh?

I invite you this Christmas to open wide your heart to this great Mystery. Accept the gift of God's love revealed in Jesus. Receive it with joy and trust this truth which Christ has entrusted His Church to proclaim. It has the power to change the trajectory of your life.

# WHY CATHOLICS GO TO MASS ON SUNDAY

Contrary to popular belief, Catholics don't go to Mass simply to pray, give praise, or to hear the Word of God, or even to receive Holy Communion. While these are all important aspects of the Mass, they are not the primary reason Catholics attend.

The true reason Catholics are obligated to go to Mass is to offer an acceptable sacrifice to God. This may come as a surprise to some, but it is the most important reason we attend Mass. The covenant with Moses was ratified by blood sacrifice and the ceremonial law of the Old Testament had very specific demands on how to offer sacrifice. Failure to fulfill the demands came with great penalties (see Exodus). Would God be so arbitrary as to throw the notion of sacrifice out with the advent of the New Testament?

No! However the Old Testament sacrifices were but a shadow of what was to come (Heb 10:1). They could not in themselves save. Yet they laid the groundwork for what was to come. The once-for-all saving sacrifice of Jesus on Calvary completes and surpasses all the sacrifices of the Old Covenant. At the Last Supper, Jesus instituted a new covenant in His blood, when he said that His blood would be poured out to ratify the new and everlasting covenant.

The sacrificial character of the Mass is manifested in the very words of institution: "This is my body which is given for you" and "This cup which is poured out for you is the New Covenant in my blood." In the Mass Christ gives us the very body which he gave up for us on the cross, the very blood which he "poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins" (see Catechism, par. 1365). The Mass is thus a sacrifice because it re-presents (makes present) the sacrifice of the cross, because it is its memorial and because it applies its fruit (ibid, par. 1366).

The Eucharist is also the sacrifice of the Church. The Church which is the Body of Christ participates in the offering of her Head. In the Mass the lives of the faithful, their praise, sufferings, prayer, and work, are united with those of Christ and with His total offering and so acquire a new value.

So, the next time someone asks you why Catholics are obligated to go to Mass every Sunday, remember that we go so that we can offer an acceptable sacrifice to God, to unite ourselves with the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross, and to join with the entire Church in worshiping God.




